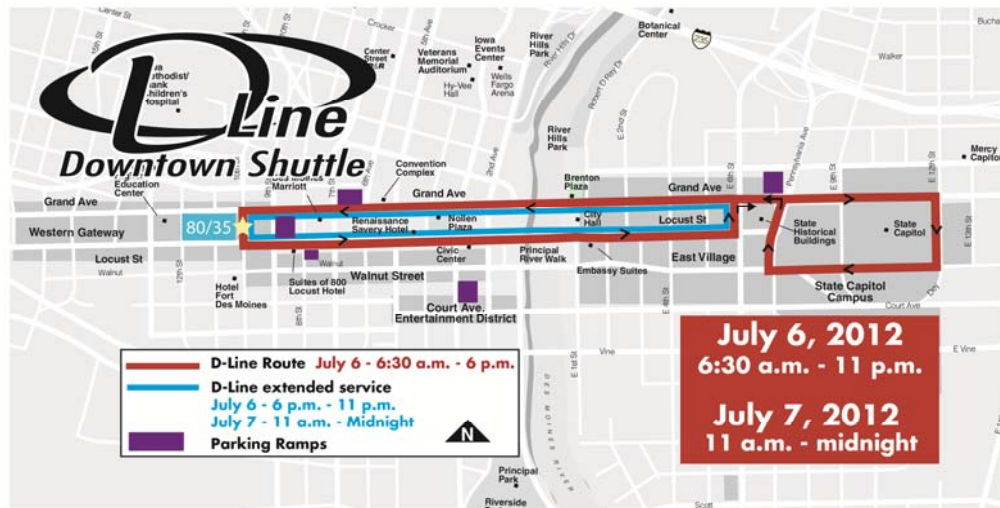

DART Adds D-Line Service for 80/35 Music Festival

The D-Line Downtown Shuttle will operate extended hours throughout the 80/35 Music Festival. The free-to-ride shuttle will operate until 11 p.m. on Friday, July 6, and from 11 a.m. to midnight on Saturday, July 7, giving concert-goers an easy connection to the festival from several bus stops and parking garages throughout downtown.

The D-Line is a downtown circulator shuttle that typically operates on Grand Avenue and Locust Street between downtown, the East Village and the Capitol Complex. The route will be adjusted for the 80/35 Music Festival:

- **6:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. Friday** -- The route will be shortened on the west end, to turn around at 10th Street near a festival entrance;
- **6 p.m. to 11 p.m. Friday and 11 a.m. to midnight Saturday** -- The route will be shortened on the west end, to turn around at 10th Street, as well as on the east end, to turn around at East 6th Street.



The D-Line is operated with support from the Downtown Community Alliance. The extended hours are being offered by DART in partnership with the 80/35 Music Festival.

The Des Moines Area Regional Transit Authority is the public transportation provider that serves Polk County. DART operates a family of transportation services that makes getting around the Greater Des Moines area easier and more convenient.
